Tired of Christmas already? Got that sinking feeling at the thought of seasonal excess? Well Matt Sheppard (Director) and his huge cast of students created the perfect antidote: a cracker of a show which warmed the hearts of the coldest of Christmas skinflints. Gareth Davies and Elliot Smith shared the role of Dickens' most famous curmudgeon, Scrooge, confidently leading the packed house through a chilly Victorian London, beautifully evoked by a clever set. As the ghostly form of the dead Marley rose up in his chains, Scrooge was led by the spirits of Christmas past, present and to come (Sophia Cuell, Vaneesha Short, Abigail Davey) to appreciate the warmth and generosity of teeming town life around him. Here, the delightful abundance of the Fezziwig home; now a frugal meal with the poor Cratchit family as they listen to Tiny Tim's last song; then hilarious parlour games at the home of his nephew. Finally, the miserable old fellow is taken from his bed by a terrifying phantom to experience what is in store for him if he does not reform his grumpy ways. Scrooge's journey is complete. And we are left with the sound of joyous carols, the sight of children playing and the wonder of gentle snow falling, to reflect on the true values of the season. This was fine ensemble playing, performed by a marvellous cast.

College leads way in A level Reforms

Sir Mike Tomlinson, former Chief Inspector of Schools, presented 70 College students with bound dissertations and AQA Certificates to celebrate the completion of the country's first Extended Projects as part of an A level programme.

The second year students had responded to the College's challenge to undertake an extended piece of research linking two of their A level subjects over the summer holidays and to write up a thesis by the October reading week.

Preparation for Module Tests

The Christmas holiday is an important time for some rest and relaxation; for most, it is a period to be spent with the family. However, time must be set aside for a period of intensive revision.

For first year students, the AS modules will be the first public examinations taken at advanced level. They are not the same as GCSE examinations and it is foolish to think that one can prepare properly for an advanced level module without serious revision. As a guideline, I would expect students to undertake the equivalent of at least FIVE full College days of revision during the Christmas Vacation. Most Hampshire schools return on Wednesday 3 January; we, however, return on Monday 8 January.

Wednesday 3 to Friday 5 January have been particularly identified as study days for students to spend the whole day working. They should not be used for additional part-time work.

Last year, the AS and A2 results for this College were exceptional compared with the national statistics. I know that parents will encourage and assist students to undertake serious revision during this time.

When do the examinations begin?

The January modules begin on Wednesday morning, 10 January 2007. Module tests are about one hour long. All candidates must be aware of the times of their examinations (see CristalWeb), and their locations in the College.

The College does **NOT** close down for study leave at this time - students must attend all their classes during the module period, except when they have a module test. If the module test is at 1.15pm, students must attend their classes in the morning and, if they have a class at 2.45pm, they must, of course, attend it.

Examination Guidelines

The College publishes a booklet for each student giving essential information about external examinations - a copy is available on CristalWeb. The conduct of examinations is subject to routine external inspection and the College complies with the regulations to the letter. Regulations relating to appeals and enquiries are also given in the booklet.
